Neighborhood Notes

Break-ins and Car Thefts

Like any neighborhood, we get reports of thefts from cars and trucks, and once in a while the vehicle itself is stolen. While this happens in good neighborhoods all over the country, not just Cumberland Hill, it doesn't make the issue any less worrisome. In <u>almost every one</u> of these cases, the vehicle was unlocked.

Please make sure you lock your vehicles, and never keep anything of value in them if they are kept outside. Thieves break windows, because they see a wallet, laptop or some other item of value in the car.

Park your car in the garage if at all possible. If you have a security alarm, make sure to use it.

Another tip to consider: Car thieves typically like dark areas, so if you can leave your porch or garage lights on

overnight, it will give them less dark spaces in which to operate. It's a small price to pay for extra security.

If you ever see any suspicious vehicles or people in our neighborhood, please try to get a license plate number, get a good description of the car or the person(s), and call the police!

Blocked Sidewalks

Over the years we receive complaints about cars, campers, golf carts, etc. blocking our sidewalks. Please be cognizant of this, as we have several walkers in the neighborhood, including parents with strollers and young children. When they have to step off the sidewalk and into the street to avoid a blocked path, it can pose a hazard to our walkers. Help keep Cumberland Hill a safe place to walk.

Barking Dogs And Their Deposits

We are still receiving the occasional complaint of barking dogs in our neighborhood, and we ask that you be cognizant of your dogs "singing" and bring them in when you hear them barking. If your neighbor brings this to your attention, please be courteous and respectful of their wishes. There is nothing worse than a pooch that continues to bark, be it day or night. If it continues to be a problem for you, we refer to Fayette County Animal Control who handle these complaints.

Also, make sure you always pick up after your dogs when walking them. Our dogs cannot do it themselves, and there is nothing worse than having to avoid piles of poop as you are walking through our neighborhood or trying to mow the lawn. This simple courtesy is a part of being a good neighbor.



Street Sign Posts

Cumberland Hill maintains our own street signs in our community and as a reminder, we ask that you please do not tape for affix any signs to our sign posts. Using duct tape will pull the paint completely off of the post, and while we maintain them by painting them every 3 or 4 years, the paint cannot stand up to a "duct taped" poster.
